Drug and Alcohol Awareness Support Group:

Substance Abuse Policy

Unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs or alcohol by students or employees on college property or at any college activity is strictly prohibited. With the above standard as a guide, it is vital that we at Eastern Idaho Technical College, (students, faculty, and staff), remember that substance abuse is an ongoing problem. Therefore it is our goal to:

- 1) Reduce alcohol and drug related problems.
- Provide specific guidelines describing both college and legal sanctions as they apply to alcohol and illicit drugs.
- 3) Identify alternatives available to those who experience substance abuse problems.

The Substance Abuse Policy Manual is available to all students, faculty, and staff in the Student Services Office. In addition to the legal sanctions summarized by the Substance Abuse Policy Manual, the following college sanctions may be enforced upon violators of the Substance Abuse Policy:

Students: Hopefully students who experience substance abuse related problems would voluntarily seek help. However, violation of the Code of Conduct may result in one or more of the following sanctions. These are listed in order of least severe to most severe. Severity of the sanctions is at the discretion of college officials.

- 1. **Warning:** A notice to the student verbally or in writing from a college official stating that a policy has been violated and that continued violation may result in more sever sanctions.
- Censure: A written reprimed warning the individual or group that repeated infractions will result in official sanctions. Restrictions on minor privileges may be imposed.
- Probation: Formal notification that a policy has been violated and indicating terms for continued enrollment. Probationary status equates to "not in good standing."
- 4. Suspension: A decision that excludes the students from classes, activities, and/or presence on college properties for at least one semester. A student who has been suspended may request readmission after his or her terms of suspension have been met. The student shall submit a written petition requesting readmission. Readmission may be granted, denied, or postponed subject to fulfillment of conditions established by the College. All successfully readmitted students will be assessed a one semester probation. Readmission will be granted on a space available basis only.
- 5. **Expulsion:** An administrative decision that terminates the student from school for an indefinite period of time.

Faculty and Staff: Employees of the College who experience substance abuse problems are also encouraged to voluntarily seek help. If a work-related substance abuse problem persists and the employee fails to correct his or her behavior, administrative action will be taken. This action may lead to mandatory completion of a treatment program or termination of employment.
